



Dear 9th Grade Student,

The Aaron Price Fellows Program is looking for 40 exceptional students for our Class of 2023. The mission of our program is to prepare highly motivated and diverse San Diego public high school students to be responsible, engaged and caring members of their community.

Fellows participate in an incredible three-year journey. The journey begins the summer prior to sophomore year at a week-long away camp where bonding and friendships start to form. Throughout the following year, Fellows visit non-profit and cultural organizations to learn about career opportunities and their role in our community. During the second summer, Fellows take a multi-day trip to continue learning about important issues and build the bonds of friendship. Throughout their junior year of high school, they learn about local and state government and attend programs on important topics such as juvenile justice.

Fellows begin the third year of the program with a June trip to Washington, DC where they meet with elected officials, tour important sites and learn about the federal government. Fellows then continue to attend local programs about national issues and leading industries during their senior year. They also receive support with college admissions.

To qualify for the program, students must:

- Be a 9th grade student at one of the six participating high schools (Hoover, Lincoln, Point Loma, Morse, San Diego & University City)
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Be available to attend monthly programs, typically scheduled on Saturdays and during school holidays
- Have diverse interests and experiences
- Have a strong desire to learn and grow
- Have a positive outlook on life
- Demonstrate verbal and written communication skills
- Plan to attend college
- Be willing to share their experiences and opinions during discussions and in written reflections

Application Process:

- Applications are available in January online at www.aaronpricefellows.org and at participating high schools
- Students must submit the application packet to their school counselor by March 6, 2020
- A subset of the applicants will move forward to a mandatory interview on April 18, 2020
- Approximately 40 students will be invited to join our Class of 2023 by April 30, 2020
